Plants short (10-30 cm tall)



Basal leaves narrow and entire

Silique is straight torulose and strictly reflexed



Plant is perennial. **Stems** several, slender, from 10-30 cm tall, decumbent at base. **Basal leaves** narrow, entire, light green and glaucous or glabrous, or with a few simple bristly hairs. **Cauline leaves** few and remote, sessile, auriculate, oblong and acute. **Inflorescence** a raceme with few flowers nodding on short pedicels, calyx dark purple, petals purple. **Fruit** is a siliqua, straight, torulose and strictly reflexed.

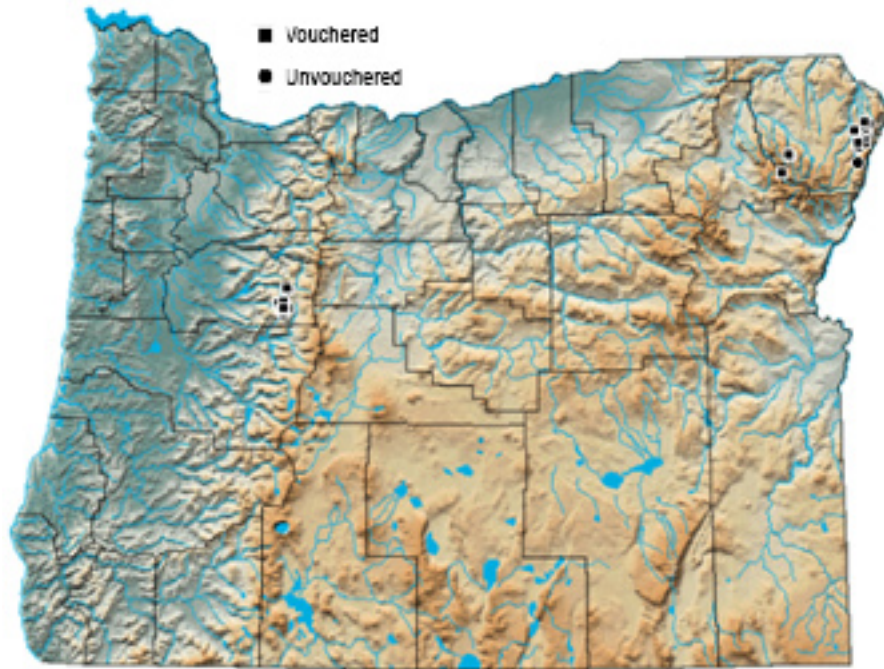

Distribution: Eagle Cap Wilderness and Hat Point Road, Wallowa County, Oregon; also Iron Mountain and Tombstone Pass area, Linn County, Oregon.

Habitat: Rocky outcrops and mountain ridges.

Elevation: 1500–2700 m

Best survey time (in flower): June to August

Associated species:

Artemisia ludoviciana (White sagebrush)

Ipomopsis aggregata ssp. *aggregata* (Skyrocket gilia, Foxfire)

Linum lewisii (Lewis flax)

Douglasia laevigata (Dwarf primrose)

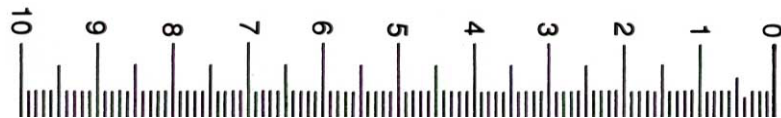
Erigeron foliosus var. *confinis* (Leafy fleabane)
