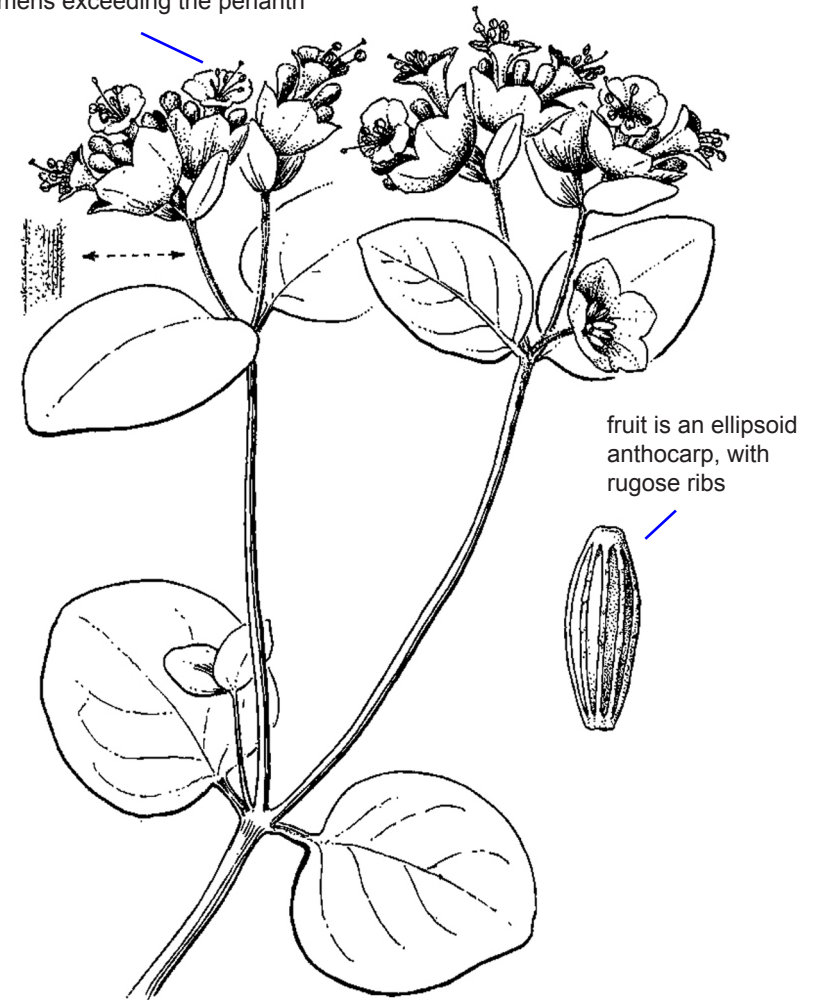

Plant is a stout perennial, 60-100 cm tall

Plant a stout perennial forming large clumps, 60 to 100 cm tall. **Stems** decumbent or ascending, branched, puberulent. **Leaves** opposite, circular to ovate-oblong, obtuse at the apex and may be sub-cordate at the base, short petiole, 5-20 mm. **Inflorescence** on terminal stalks or in upper axils, involucre 4-7 flowered, greenish to purplish, perianth rose-purple, broadly funnelform, stamens exceeding the perianth. **Fruit** is an ellipsoid anthocarp, glabrous, ribbed and rugose-tuberculate on the ribs.

Best survey time (in flower): May

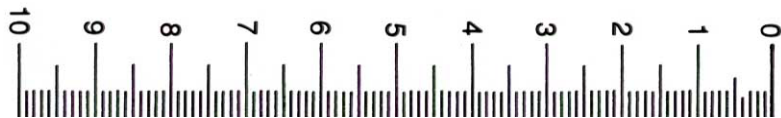
